Fish Habitat Improvement

The East Gippsland Catchment Management Authority will improve in-stream fish habitat in the estuarine stretches of the Mitchell River thanks to a new project funded by recreational fishing licence fees.

The \$100,000 project builds on extensive fish habitat improvement works over several years already undertaken by the CMA in rivers flowing into the Gippsland Lakes.

This project is one of 17 new ones, worth more than \$1.1 million, that will contribute to the State Government's Target One Million plan to get more people fishing, more often.
