

HOOK: Kamasan B170 or Tiemco 9300 Size 12 to 18 THREAD: Danville Pre - waxed thread 6/0 Brown

TAIL: Ginger brown hackle fibres BODY: Stripped peacock herl.

Wings: Mallard or starling primary wing feather slips. HACKLE: Ginger brown, neck or saddle hackle.

ITALIAN FLY CASTING. By Ray Throup

A few months ago I attended an art show hosted and featuring Trevor Hawkins art. On the day Ian Mitchell was going to run a demonstration on Italian fly casting. The

casting aspect to the day didn't eventuate as the weather was bad with wind and rain all day. Trevor had a captive audience, but the casting was postponed to a later date.

The date was changed to the 26th of August. The demonstration took place at Saladin lodge Narbethong. Members could participant in some free instruction and a membership cost \$25.00. I felt this was cheap and a good chance to sharpen some casting skills before trout opening. It turns out Italian streams are very similar to what we have here in Victoria. The techniques were developed to perform accurate casts in and under obstacles such as branches.



All participants were required to bring a 7 to 8-foot 4 weight or less rod, a line 1 weight less than the rod and a 14-foot tapered leader.

A fast action rod is preferred as the caster was required to perform extremely tight loops with only a rod length of line outside the rod tip. For a 7-foot 6-inch rod you will have 29-foot from hand to fly, 'plenty of distance on a small stream'.



The goal was to get your fly to land first before the line hits the water, allowing for aerial mends to create slack if needed. The method is to create the forward loop as early as practical, the rod is held on an angle to reduce the likely hood of hitting your tip with the fly.

At the end of the day all participants had a casting competition where we had to cast through a frame 2.5 metres wide and 2 metres high from 20 feet distance. I made the final 2 but didn't get the chocolates. It was a very informative day enjoyed by all that attended.
